Title	Emergency small grants programme update

1.0 Purpose of paper

To update Trustees on the activity undertaken to date to implement and distribute emergency small grants to the unpaid carers sector.

2.0 Background

Trustees will recall that at the March 2020 Trustee Meeting a decision was made to cancel the Development Grants funding round for unpaid carers. Instead it was agreed to provide emergency small grants funding to carer organisations struggling to cope with the challenges of supporting unpaid carers during the Covid-19 lockdown.

Within weeks of this decision, programme criteria and an application process were developed and then agreed by Trustees. £300,000 was allocated to an immediate small grants programme (awards of up to £10,000) and £200,000 allocated to a second wave of support in the autumn of 2020.

The funding was launched by invitation only on 16th April 2020 to carer organisations that were either current grantees, had received a grant in the past 5 years or who had applied in the last cancelled funding round.

3.0 Current situation

The funding window for this opportunity was open for one month and applicants were asked to submit requests at any point during the month. Award decisions were made at the two week point and at the deadline. Only 50% of funding was allocated at the two week point to ensure that the money could be distributed equally.

By the end of two weeks 12 applications had been submitted requesting £91,464 of funding. By the deadline date a further 16 applications had been received requesting £135,678 of funding. The Director, in consultation with the Chair and

Vice Chair offered 27 grants totalling £213,596. Appendix 1 contains a table showing the organisations who applied, the amount of the request and the amount awarded.

The response to the funding opportunity has been extremely positive. Other than one application, the applications have all fitted the criteria that was developed after consultation with current grantees, other carer charities, national bodies such as Carers UK and other funders. Our ability to be agile, develop a simple online application process, make quick decisions and release funding in a short time frame has enabled grantee organisations to increase their support and capacity to carers.

4.0 Next Steps

Once the current pressures on organisations have eased slightly we will send round a short survey asking grantees to feedback their experience of the funding in terms of a) the application process and b) the impact of the funding on their work during this period. We will also ask them for insight into their current situation to inform our thinking about the second wave of support in the Autumn.

Hopefully the picture will be clear enough by October to share a paper with a suggested funding focus and criteria for phase 2 at the October 2020 meeting.

In the longer term we will also look at how we can pull together our learning from this to help inform our grant making in the longer term. We will also look to identify ways of sharing with other funders our experience of being a small funder and taking this kind of approach to supporting a sector in crisis.
