We have a Theory of Change. Our strength based approach, recognises young women's strengths, abilities, talents and lived experience.

Our work is a balance of support, challenge/ opportunities and fun. Our staff are very experienced at building trust and rapport with very vulnerable young women. We target young women who experience challenges and barriers including:

*Girls and Young women at risk of/ affected by ACES

*young mums and young women who are pregnant

*Young women from black and global majority community

*young women who are care care experienced

*young women who are excluded or struggled with school and college

*young carers

*young women getting their lives back on track

*young women living in poverty

*Young women who have experienced/ witnessed domestic abuse

*Young women at risk of sexual/ criminal exploitation/ harm from gangs

*Young women new to the country

*Young women who have lived experience of mental health

We have a range of services including:

*Peer Support Groups,

*Individual Support for girls and young women re safety issues for young women facing sexual/ criminal exploitation.

*School groupwork programmes

*Support for young facing multiple needs

*Counselling Support

*Therapeutic groups

Over 75% of our staff and 80% of our volunteers were supported by Getaway Girls and have lived experience. Over 85% of young women supported are from black and global majority communities. Voice and Influence is embedded throughout our work at all levels. 2 Young women are trustees, all staff are interviewed by young women, Young women's voices are vital within the development of the work from research, planning, delivery of services, production of resources, events, influencing decision makers and evaluation.

We are a founding member of Women and Girls alliance Leeds which aims for a gender lens on Leeds, supporting girls and young women's needs and leading to policy and systems change.

Partner with national AGENDA Alliance- research, policy and reports re young women with multiple needs.

We have won 12 Awards including National Children and Young People Now Awards for Youth work and Children and young people's charity of the year.

Explain how the grant will be spent

Who will be responsible for overseeing and delivering this work?

The work will be delivered by qualifies, experienced women workers with a track record of establishing trust and positive relationships with young women from a diverse range of backgrounds and needs.

Flavia Docherty, CEO of Getaway Girls will oversee the work. She is a qualified/ experienced manager with 40 years experience of supporting women and girls and 25 years experience of management.

All staff will have clear aims, objectives, outcomes and a work plan. All work will be monitored through our Civi CRM system and the Outcomes Star will be used to record baseline and distance travelled.

Young women's stories of change will be recorded.

All staff will have supervision and will have relevant training including Safeguarding, Trauma Informed practice, Protective Behaviours, Choice Theory.
