Paper based package complete and print run priced and agreed		Year 2 As a result of ongoing review, the Distance Learning programme was proven to be a challenge in terms of literacy and ability in unfacilitated delivery. These challenges were not overcome during the pandemic despite a number of revisions in terms of how it was delivered. Thankfully, the end of the restrictions meant that we were very quickly able to start delivery face to face, using the same materials. The Third House Trust once again supported the print costs and the production of some Resettlement Packs with a grant of £10K

The content of the programme has developed with new sessions and has also been kept up to date with legislative changes.

2c	All resettlement prisons and Probation regional leads contacted		Year 2 Resettlement Prisons in the North West were initially targeted, but it soon became apparent that ALL prisons in the region released older prisoners and so the reach was extended to all categories with the exception of the Long Term High Security Estate (Cat A).

Pilot x 5 prisons Pilot x 4 Approved Premises Generate Sales to £15K	March 2023	Year 2 Having taken the decision to offer the programme free of charge in the pilot area, with a view to gathering evidence of success to support sales in other geographical regions, this route has supported a sale at HMP Risley (£7K) delivering the programme over a 6 month period and a 3 week programme delivery at HMP Usk (£2.5K) with an indication of a further delivery in June 2023. We also received a second grant of £10K from The Third House Trust to support with printing costs and the provision of Resettlement Kits (the kits include hygiene items to help those released in the first days back in the community)

Training proposals submitted to two new prisons	30 th March 23	Year 2 HMPs Wymott & Haverigg formed part of the project, both receiving two programmes during the year.(48 beneficiaries) In addition, HMP Kirkham and HMP Preston agreed to be part of the Project, each having facilitated delivery on two occasions also.(48 beneficiaries) A proposal was submitted for a Contract at HMP Standford Hill for 1 year, this proposal was successful and though just outside of our target date, work will start in April 2023. (Value £6K) Additionally, we are working with HMP Erlestoke to introduce the programme there in the first quarter of the financial year April-June 2023. (Value £2.5K)
3c.	Training proposals submitted to 5 community hubs / Probation Hostels Add in NW AP	30 st March 23	Year 2 We delivered the programme in 4 Approved Premises during 22/23. The number of older residents in Approved Premises is far smaller in comparison to the prison estate, the number of beneficiaries reached was 16. We are delighted to be able to share that, as we'd hoped, the North West AP Management Team recognise the benefit of the programme so much so that we will be training their Engagement Officers to deliver the programme in at least 11 of the 15 North West Approved



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Premises. The costs (£10K) have been agreed and training dates are being scheduled for May.
